All structures in the burn area between Old Rag Fire Road and Thornton Gap powerline, as depicted on the 1929 USGS topo map, were visited. disturbances to the site were documented. This site was located about 3/4 mle west of the SNP boundary on Broad Hollow trail. It is a partially standing wooden cabin, a springbox, and rock terraces and walls. Site is located on a steep, terraced slope to allow farming. The roofless cabin is a shingled log-frame set on a stone foundation. An adjacent outbuilding was burned down in the fire. Glass, ceramic, and metal historic artifacts were visible on the surface.
